## Scrapped Idea



The entire concept of this volume came as an idea of having a book that could be read over and over again in a perfect loop.

That had its set of problems, but I ran with it, giving it its own aesthetic by setting it as a weekly loop across an entire month.

Late in the planning stage, I came with the idea of a weekly strip that was constant throughout the volume, similar to the Sunday, Monday and Friday strips. The concept was that of an old man who died that day, but naturally came back over and over every week, having to deal with saying goodbye to his son and daughter multiple times. He was aware of the loop like Dmitri and the killer, of course; the explanation being that only those who died (and the man who set the loop in the first place by breaking the clock) could remember every loop. That would be how Dmitri could originally become aware of the loop.



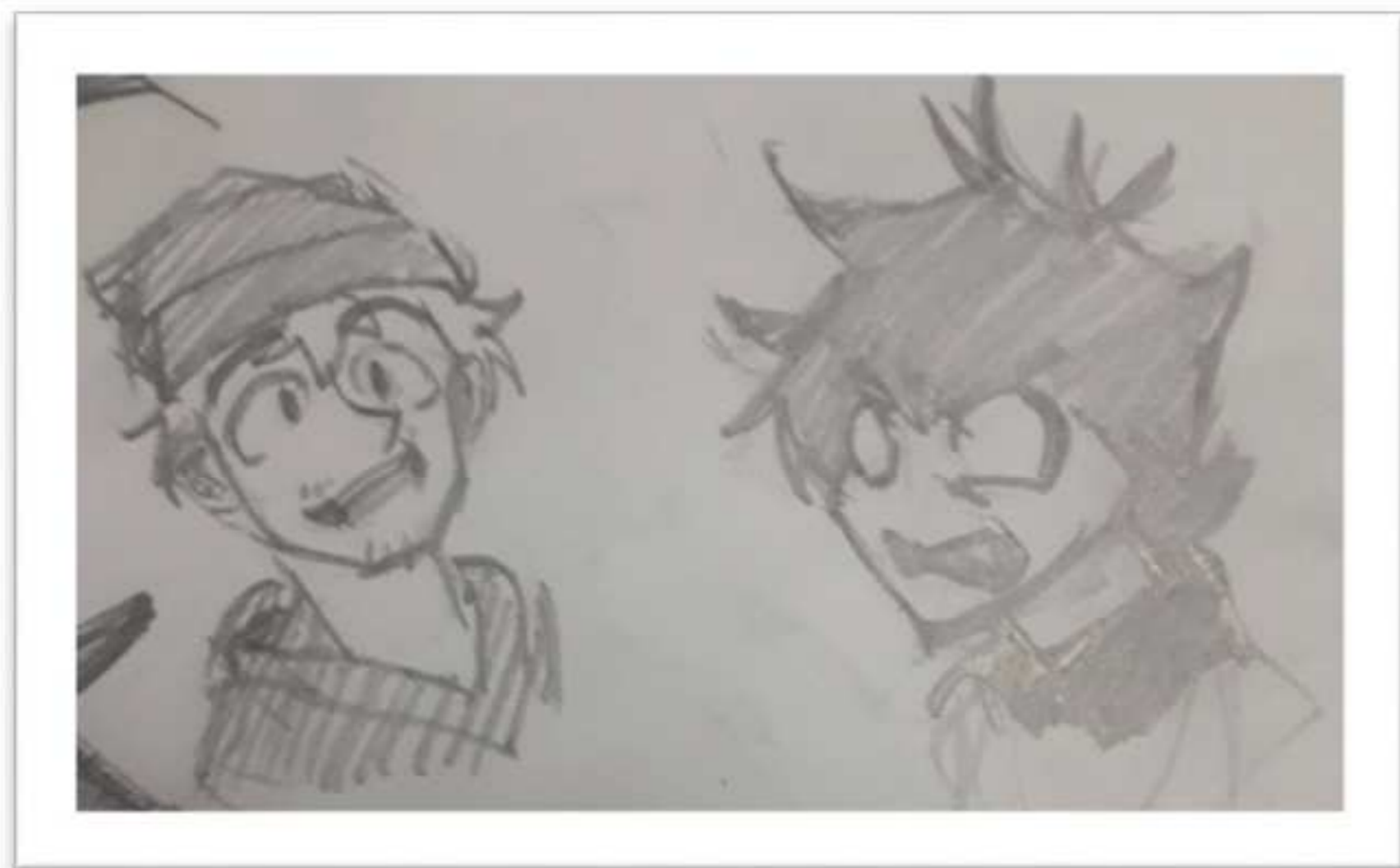
*Every morning I woke up after dying, recognizing myself in the reflexion of the window was harder and harder.*
